



Frequently Asked Questions - Registration and Submission

Who registers? (Student, judge, teacher)

Students – Students need to register themselves. If students are working in a group, only one person from the group should register because they will enter their team member’s information. The information required for each student is first and last name, grade, home address, students email address and parent email address. The entry title, division, category, website URL (if applicable), School name, School Address, Teachers name and teacher email address.

Teachers – teachers need to register all of the students associated with them. The information required is the division, total students from your class that are participating, entry title with associated students first and last name, and category.

Judges – Judges can only register themselves. (You cannot register you and your spouse at the same time.) Each judge will need to share their first and last name, email address, profession, if you require any ADA accommodations, dietary restrictions, the number of years you have judged, preferences for division and category, if you can stay for the second round judging, and your address.

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What’s the registration deadline? (Student, judge, teacher)

Students- **Saturday February 17, 2018**

Teachers- **Saturday February 17, 2018**

Judges- **Saturday March 3, 2018**

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What’s the submission deadline?

Saturday February 24, 2018

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What’s the difference between registration and submission?

Registration is simply you saying you are participating in the event and providing information so that a schedule for judging can be created, communications can be sent to you and the appropriate amount of supplies can be ordered.

Submission only applies to people registered in the Paper, Documentary and Website categories. Participants in those categories must send their projects ahead of time to the coordinator. The reason these categories require a submission is because they typically have much more content so they are sent to judges ahead of the competition to provide adequate time to read/watch/interact the projects. All of these categories still have a specific judging time on the day of the event where judges will again review the projects and interview the presenter(s).

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How do I submit papers/documentaries/websites?
