Purpose: Summer Museum Camps Interns will work at Museum Camps throughout the summer (both at Cincinnati Museum Center and at offsite locations) and will assist Coordinators and Instructors with supervision and teaching of campers and organizing paperwork, materials and supplies.

Key Responsibilities:

- Prepare and organize materials, supplies and snacks for Museum Camps. Assist on shopping trips for supplies when necessary.
- Help with morning meetings when at off-site locations or when necessary at Union Terminal.
- Support Museum Camp instructors and coordinators during Monday check-in and organize paperwork every Monday. Help daily drop-off and pick-up procedures.
- Ensure that instructors receive a lunch break and supervise campers while giving breaks to instructors.
- Guarantee Museum Camps attendees' safety by adhering to Cincinnati Museum Center
 policies and holding instructors to safety standards. This includes the close monitoring
 of children during lunch time, recess, on field trips, at offsite locations and throughout
 the camp day. All medical conditions should be kept in mind during activities.
- Work in camps during days when extra hands are needed. Help with activities and lesson plans. Interact with and help campers.
- Attend all Museum Camps training sessions.
- Other duties as assigned

- A degree, or working towards a degree in education, archaeology, paleontology, history, art, theatre, chemistry or related field preferred.
- Certified in First Aid/CPR or willing to become certified.
- Experience working with children in an informal or formal education setting.
